CityU Scholarship

Regulations

The establishment of CityU Scholarship aims to reward those local / non-local students who have achieved outstanding academic performance and/or contribution to the University. The following regulations shall apply with effect from 2019-20 academic year:

- 1. Full-time local and non-local undergraduate students[#] who (i) have achieved a CGPA* at 3.7 or above by the end of Semester B of the year 2018/19, or the top five students (in terms of CGPA by the end of Semester B of the year 2018/19) in each College / School; and (ii) are not benefitted from the HKSAR Government Scholarship (SFA no. 547) are eligible to be nominated for the Scholarship.
- 2. The selection criteria are as follows:
 - Excellent performance in academic studies
 - Recognized contribution to the institution/society
 - Demonstrated leadership and good communication skills
 - Strong commitment to the Hong Kong community; and/or
 - Demonstrated good conduct
- 3. There shall be a maximum of 100 awards and the value of each award shall be HK\$30,000 (a one-off award). The allocation of awards is on the basis of the distribution of student population amongst Colleges and Schools of the year. Respective College/School shall maintain an appropriate balance in allocating the awards between local and non-local recipients.
- 4. In 2019/20, the award quota for Colleges/Schools is as follows:

5. Nomination(s) from respective College/School shall reach the Student Development Services by the early of December each year and the award(s) shall be made as soon as the endorsement has been sought.

Remark.

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the Community Relations Committee of the University Council has recommended that each award recipient is expected to make an annual donation of at least HK\$200 to City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term will be incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes, whether they are donated by external donors or contributed by University funding, with effect from February 2008.

[#] Students who are taking leave of absence in the awarding year are not eligible for the Scholarship.

^{*}The GPA for summer term 2019 will not be included, which shall be counted in the following year.
