據市場研究公司Gartner公司發表的研究報告稱,IT審計師目前已成為全球性最搶手的專業人才。這些人才一般都具備全面的電腦系統軟硬體知識,對網絡和系統安全有特殊的敏感性,並且對財務會計和部門內部控制有深刻的理解。國際會計師審計師事務所、IT專業諮詢公司、經濟管理類的集成軟件供應商、IT管理顧問等,都將信息系統運行風險與安全管理作為諮詢和服務的重點。多數的大型跨國公司,由於普遍使用大型管理信息系統,都非常重視對信息系統安全和穩定性的控制,常常高薪聘請IT審計師進行內部審計。IT審計師主要向客戶提供與信息系統相關的風險評估及管理服務,從事的工作包括:評估每個被發現的風險的嚴重程度、落實反風險措施以減輕特定的影響、評價和評估任何反風險措施的有效性(以及它們的成本效益)。

IT行業的高科技、時尚和優厚待遇吸引很多人爭先恐後地加入「IT人」的行列。然而,激烈的競爭氣氛,巨大的工作壓力,相對較長的作業時間,封閉的工作環境,這些都讓從業者開始氣餒及懷疑,在表面上的華麗背後,IT工作真的是理想選擇嗎?所以要成為一位出色的「IT人」,本身須具備全面的資訊技術、豐富的專業知識、敏銳的洞察能力、成熟的工作態度、徹底解決問題及準確的決定能力等等的素質。在此與同學們共勉之!

My Exchange in Yonsei University, South Korea

My Blog

Hong Kong people love Korea very much. They are getting crazy on K-pop Star, Korean drama, and Korean foods. However, they can only experience Korea as tourists. For me, the exchange program has given me a chance to study in Korea – I made friends with local Korean, I learned Korean from Local Korean teachers, I could deeply taste the Korean culture and know the society. I bet this will make everyone jealous.

My Pre-departure Checklist

Before departure to Korea, a student visa (type D-2) is needed. When applying for a visa, your bank account should have a saving of at least HKD\$25,000 for 3 months. Also, a supporting letter from CityU showing you are being sent as exchange students is needed. You are required to apply for this letter with MEAO.

Just Arrived...

I was first so nervous because it was my first trip to Korea and first time to travel alone. The arrival was my worst day in Korea. It was so difficult to carry two big suitcases all along when walking on the street, especially when the place was most crowded in the evening. The situation was worsen by my ignorance of the way to the hostel. There was no other way but to phone up my host at the hostel. He guided me to the place, and helped me carry the suitcases upstairs because there was no lift. After that, he took me to a traditional Korean restaurant to have my first meal in Korea.

Orientation

The orientation was held for a whole day. It provided lots of information for students to note during their stay in Korea and their study in Yonsei. The campus map is the most important. Unlike CityU, Yonsei campus is so huge that it is almost ten times larger

than CityU and it is easy to get lost there.

Also, we met our mentor and other mentees for the first time in the Mentors Club. It was my first step to make friends with local Korean people and students from all around the world. We had our dinner and party in a traditional fried-chicken restaurant and it was a nice evening.

My Place

There is a kind of popular accommodation for students, which is called고시원. It is like a student residence hall, but having all individual rooms. Also, rice, kimchi, coffee, noodles are available always in the kitchen. Since it is cheap, many local and foreign students prefer to live in this kind of house. The host was a local Korean family. They were very kind that they always cooked traditional Korean food for us. And at the day I left Hong Kong, they helped me take my heavy luggage to the bus stop. I was so thankful for their care and help during my stay.

My First Class

At the first class, I noticed that the notes were all Korean. Fortunately, the professor gave me an English reference book. He also gave me some extra lessons after classes. Attributed to his extra time and effort, I finally got good result in the exam.

Also, the relationship between professors and students were very good. They always had dinner and party together. It is not difficult to find photos for the happy time we spent together.

The learning motivation in Yonsei is worth appreciating. Besides lecture notes, most students also studied different reference books. Also, they seldom skipped classes and could pay attention even though they got drunk the night before.

People I Met

Because of the group projects, I made some friends with some local students. One called Cada impressed me most. He came from Turkey and was studying in Yonsei as a regular student. I admired him very much because he managed to speak fluent Korean. He recommended good places to travel, good methods to stay warm in freezing winter. He also helped me check the exam schedule which was in Korean.

Korean people love travelling. When I travelled in Sochu, I had two Korean roommates from Seoul. It is funny that Korean girls also love Hong Kong pop stars and our food very much. They said that Leung Chiu Wai and Leslie Cheung were very handsome.

Out of Classroom

The most exciting extra-curricular activity was held in a school in Yo-Ko Jeon. It was a sport festival held between Yonsei University and Korea University. There were five different sports games. I have watched the basketball, baseball, football and ruby games. All the students wore different colors of T-shirts representing their schools. A sea of blue and another sea of red were cheering for their school representatives. Different schools had their own cheering teams, songs and corresponding dance and motions. However, once I took out my phone, they smiled and seemed to know why I was there. It is funny that though we could not speak the same language, we still could communicate. 4-month exchange life was totally not enough for me. It was a pity that when I began to get used to live in Korea just like local people, I had to leave. My Pre-departure Checklist

Just Arrived...

Orientation

My First Class
