My Pre-departure Checklist

Before I went to mainland China, I checked the expiry date of my Mainland Travel Permit for Hong Kong and Macau Residents.

Please also get ready with you the address of your school and the dormitory for locating the place more conveniently.

Just Arrived...

The first day was unforgettable. I went to my host university by taxi. When I arrived at the university, I did not know where I should go first. I asked the local students for help. Finally, one of the students brought me to the place for registration and got me to my dorm. I was grateful for his help.

Orientation

There was no orientation organized by the host university but it was not difficult to meet new friends since we could use putonghua to communicate. The students in the university were very nice and friendly and most of them helped eagerly the new students to adapt to the new environment.

My Place

My accommodation was fair. I lived with a Taiwan student. When I arrived at my dorm, it was a little bit dusty and I cleaned it for half an hour. Insects were common in our flat for the summer. To avoid the insects coming into our room, we turned on the air-conditioner.

My First Class

The learning style was different from CityU. In Shanghai Jiao Tong University, they only have lectures but not tutorial classes. The lecturers are more focused in teaching the knowledge and you

will not be taught for methods to solve any questions. It is the responsibility of students to prepare for their exam and not much work will be tailored for exam preparation. On the contrary, in CityU, we have tutorial classes allowing students to work on more questions and to seek help from the instructors whenever we have problems in the questions.

After the exchange, I realized the importance of self study. Students should be more active in learning.

People I Met

I met some local students in class and they are really nice. Although my Putonghua is not good, they listened to me patiently and helped me whenever I got problems.

It was observed that the local students would spend most of their time on study, and spare very little time on entertainment.

Out of Classroom

I spent some time to travel in other cities in China. I went to Beijing, Xian, Nanjing, Hangzhou ,etc. I travelled with my friends from Taiwan and Hong Kong and found that Taiwanese are generally very polite and friendly. My friends taught me a lot by sharing their experiences with me.

Besides, I spent much time on sports activities too. I played football quite regularly with the local students and did exercise in gym room quite often.

Money

I brought enough money for this exchange trip. The daily cost was not high in China if you did not travel to other cities. Also, Hong Kong exchange students will be given a bit subsidy from the China government.

The most memorable moment is having a long talk with my friends before we said goodbye to each other. We spent a few nights doing deep chatting in the dorm allowing our better understanding of one another. I miss my friends so much and I hope I can meet them again in the future.
